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Greenwich University is Ranked in Impact Ranking 2022 for the first time in the history of the university surpassing many reputed Pakistani universities.

The Times Higher Education Impact Rankings are the only global performance tables (Ranking) that assess universities against the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Greenwich University participated in the Impact Rankings for the first time this year. The university has achieved an overall ranking of 1001+ in the Times Higher Education Impact Ranking, parallel to DHA Suffa University, Dawood Engineering University, University of Education Lahore, UET Lahore, etc. In Pakistan, Greenwich University has achieved an overall ranking of 49th and ranks 15th for SDG

3 (Good Health & Well-Being), 37th for SDG 4 (Quality Education) and 11th for SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth).

Greenwich University has surpassed some prominent universities in the rankings, including National University of Computing & Emerging Sciences (FAST), Mehran University of Engineering and Technology, Sir Syed University of Engineering and Technology, and International Islamic University.

The 2022 Impact Rankings is the fourth edition, and the overall ranking includes 1,406 universities from 106 countries/regions. ■

student understanding.



1. **President** - the chief officer of the university and is responsible for the operation of the entire university within the framework of general policies provided by the Board of Trustees in keeping with the laws of the state.
2. **Vice President** - have executive responsibilities as members of the Office of the President, where they function with the President as a team.
3. **General Secretary** - the head of the administrative organization and responsible to the rector for its operation.
4. **Joint Secretary** - would perform the duties as General Secretary in the absence of General Secretary.
5. **Treasurer** - Ensures timely debt service payments by providing liquidity for operations and maintaining a healthy cash position.



The Student Development Council Elections were held on 26th March at the campus. The day of election was full of energy and enjoyment as students voted their choices and the candidates were waiting eagerly for the results. Students in these elections played an integral part by exercising their right to choose their President, Vice President, Joint Secretary, General Secretary, And Treasurer.





The Oath-Taking Ceremony was held on March 30, 2022, at Greenwich University Campus. The elected candidates took oaths and pledged to always serve Greenwich and its interests to the best of their ability.

Student Development Council is a progressive body that serves to the maintenance of on-campus diversity and inclusivity. The Student Development Council works closely with the University Management and Student Societies.

Greenwich University currently hosts 10 student societies, ranging from Literature, Debate, Performing Arts, Career Development, Event Management, and others providing students various year-round opportunities to sharpen their professional capabilities within the University. 


Awareness Session on Pakistan Stock Exchange




Beach Party
